Emergency Veteran assistance service program. Giving veterans financial assistances with temporary housing support, resources, education, jobs. Also providing 6 months of follow up and referral support.

The goal is to provide unsheltered and underserved at-risk Veteran populations in Riverside and San Bernardino counties. The number of Veterans who are at-risk of homelessness is increasing in Riverside and San Bernardino counties. We attribute the increase to Covid-19 and current economic environment (rising cost).

Covid-19 and the current economics has disparately impacted low-income and elderly Veterans households. In the past several years, more than 800 Inland Empire volunteers and staff counted 2,884 homeless individuals, including 2,155 individuals who were unsheltered and 729 who were sheltered. RNHF along with other charities have put efforts to tackle this problem and ensure the unsheltered and underserved individuals and families, are provided with services and resources to rebuild their lives.

The IPRP supports our community and greater society mission to recover from the economics' impact of the pandemic.

- Provide Veteran with the support requested.
- 6 Month follow up with Veteran to help with their success
